



- Modernize facilities

Findings – Overall Trends - Modernize Facilities

- Overcrowded classrooms at all schools, especially Pierrepont
- RHS outdoor field (unusable due to poor condition)
- RHS auditorium needs refreshing
- Pierrepont Multipurpose Room and Gym needs updating/larger size
- Union Gym needs updating/larger size
- Update Science labs at Union and RHS
- RHS Mortimer Avenue wing needs updating
- K Center playgrounds need updating
- K Center Nurse's suite
- Long-term solution for bus parking/storage

Findings – Overall Trends – Improve Communication

- Full-time public relations/communications director
- Bi-lateral communications: Rutherford and BOE
- Continued outreach for Special Education; out-of-district students participating in:
 - Family Fun Nights
 - Socials
 - o Teams












RHS - PROPOSED CAFETERIA






RHS – EXISTING LOWER LEVEL FLOOR PLAN



RHS – EXISTING FIRST FLOOR PLAN




RHS – EXISTING SECOND FLOOR PLAN



 - At 3,139 SF it is 48% smaller than the gyms at Lincoln and Washington Schools.
- New gymnasium behind cafeteria.
- Use old gym while replacing, then repurpose space.
 - Science learning labs
- Air conditioning for auditorium.
- Wood Floor Moisture Damage Correction (Throughout School)
- Front Pediment Column Restorations





 - Including A/C




PIERREPONT ES GYM / CLASSRM. ADDITION






LINCOLN ES SITE DIAGRAM






WASHINGTON ES SITE DIAGRAM






KINDERGARTEN CENTER SITE DIAGRAM




KINDERGARTEN CENTER LOWER LEVEL PLAN
